An overview of the elements of business which exposes students to the major disciplines within business such as accounting, finance, marketing, production/operations, and human resources/ Topics treated include the role of business in society, economics, globalization, technology, law as it affects business, trends in management practices, and leadership. This class will provide a framework for all other coursework in the school of business.

The class also looks at how various religions have addressed business in general and finance more specifically. We will make use of speakers, case studies, and academic research alongside religious readings.
